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The purpose of this paper is to update the Board on developments with some of the more significant capital schemes on the Salisbury District Hospital site since the date of the last report in February '18.

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Project team and users are currently trialing more modern equipment which is more space efficient in some of the consulting rooms with the aim to agree which of the rooms will require some adjustments. Once the evaluations have taken place, costs will be sought to determine the changes required to allow more functionality within the affected consulting rooms.

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Building work started in the former ophthalmology temple level 3 in early November. The contractor completed the works in mid-May which was a month later than w4(hi)3(es/2(t)-7(edob7c)re(ub)ti@

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A multi-disciplinary stakeholder group has been implemented to oversee this scheme. The location for the new scanner has been approved and the equipment specification drafted. Procurement processes are being undertaken involving equipment evaluations.

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A multi disciplinary stakeholder group has been implemented to draft a full business case / options appraisal for the replacement of one of the cardiac catheter labs together with the haemodynamic monitoring system used in both labs
